The 2018 goal is to achieve a proficiency of 76.9% of our 3rd graders based on MCA Reading assessments.

In 2018, 18 of 37 students (49%) proficient

Close the Achievement Gap(s) Between Student Groups

We will reduce the achievement gap to 16.5% between non FRL and FRL students in all grades based on the results of the state MCA math scores.

122 of 181 non-FRL students were proficient 79 of 154 FRL students were proficient Decreased from 17.5% in 2017 to 16.1% in 2018 (-1.4%)

All Students Career- and College-Ready by Graduation

Our goal for 2018 is all grade 8 students will have a math proficiency rate of 65% based upon MCA Math results.

26 out of 39 th grade students (66.7%) were proficient

All Students Graduate

Our goal for 2017 is to reach a 90 percent graduation rate by the year 2020 with no student group below 85 percent.
