# Why take college credits in High School?

- FREE OPPORTUNITIES TO EARN COLLEGE CREDIT
- OPPORTUNITY TO TAKE GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES

- OPPORTUNITY TO TAKE MORE CLASSES IN MAJOR/PROGRAM

### **COLLEGE NOW and REACH (concurrent enrollment)**

#### What is it?

- Earn college credit with BOLD teachers certified to teach course
- NO TEST AT THE END OF THE YEAR TO EARN CREDIT (unlike AP classes)

### Eligibility:

- Juniors: 3.0 GPA or top 30% of class
- Seniors: 3.0 GPA or top 50% of class
- Students who DO NOT qualify CAN request an appeal to take the class for college credit

# Classes for College Credit at BOLD

#### College NOW

- College Pre-Calculus (5 credits)
- College Calculus (5 credits)
- College Government (3 credits)
- College Mobile App (4 credits)
- College Computer IT (3 credits)
- College Business Exploration (3 credits)
- College Speech Communications (3 credits)
- College Digital World (3 credits)

#### REACH

- Introduction into Education (3 credits)
- American History (split into American History 1 & American History 2)
  - Each worth 4 credits for a total of 8 credits

# Common Myths about Concurrent Enrollment

#### 1. "The credits aren't accepted"

a. HERE IS THE DEAL: PSEO and Concurrent Enrollment are SO COMMON and nearly every college is jumping at the opportunity so credits are accepted NEARLY everywhere (minnesota state universities and community/technical schools, MOST private schools and University of MINNESOTA)

#### 2. "They aren't going to even count towards my major so why bother?"

a. The classes you enroll in are general education courses and these are classes you would take if you are attending a 4 year school, so they might not apply towards your MAJOR but they TYPICALLY apply towards your general education for graduation from the school

## POST SECONDARY THROUGH COLLEGE

#### What is it?

- Students ENROLL in the COLLEGE (any that have PSEO programs) and take
  CLASSES with PROFESSORS/INSTRUCTORS who work for the college
- Options include FULL TIME (not taking a class at BOLD) OR PART TIME (some classes at BOLD some at college)

### Eligibility:

- Varies by school but MOST are:
  - SENIORS: 3.0 GPA OR TOP 50% of their class
  - JUNIORS: 3.0 GPA OR TOP 30% of their class

## POST SECONDARY THROUGH COLLEGE

#### HOW DO I APPLY?

- Many PSEO applications are online (Ridgewater is paper copy/Ms. Stein has extras)
- See Ms. Stein and complete the application
  - o If you are confused by any part of the application STOP BY MS. STEIN'S OFFICE.
- Ask Ms. Stein for a transcript to be sent to the school you are applying PSEO to

#### MS. STEIN CAN MAIL COMPLETED APPLICATIONS

The college will CONTACT YOU NOT BOLD if you are admitted or not

## POST SECONDARY THROUGH COLLEGE

### Things to consider:

- classes you take through the college ARE NOT BOLD CLASSES
- The student is responsible for themselves (grades, answering email, doing the work)
- CREDITS DO TRANSFER TO OTHER COLLEGES AND ON BOLD TRANSCRIPT
- The difference between college professors and your BOLD High School teachers
- When applying to colleges you need to contact the college for your PSEO classes
  AND BOLD for your transcripts
